

Wildlife status summary is based on both the species trend and its status in the landscape










## Annual game count

Charts show the number of animals seen each year per 100 km driven during the game count, for Doro !nawas and Uibasen Twyfelfontein combined. As a point of reference, the dashed horizontal line represents the combined 10-year average in Palmwag and Etendeka concessions. Status flags reflect the general count trend over the last 5 years.





